Accountability

- Election authority answerable to government and governed
- With decisionmaking authority comes responsibility for professionalism



Transparency



- Clear rules of engagement, known to all
- Advertising and education
- A scrutinized vote counting environment

Independence

- Not dependent on current political authority.
- Separate authority to conduct business
- Access to sufficient funding to conduct required work



Integrity

INTEGRITY Is choosing your thoughts and actions based on values rather than personal gain

- In order to have a trusted election process, one must begin with trustworthy election officials.
- It is about the character of the person

Impartiality




- Where there are 2 or more sides to an issue, election administration is not connected to either side.
- Neither a proponent nor an opponent.
- Fair and perceived as fair
